CORNAREA



The Cornarea Winery is located within the territories of Canale, a town in the heart of the Roero, small hilly region that borders with Le Langhe area. Since ancient times it has been a wine producing territory.

Cornarea owes its name to the hill where its vineyards are to be found and that has been known with this name since the year 1000: on its top, the unmistakable Villa can be seen, built at the beginning of the last century by the then Canale Mayor Mr Eugenio Grillone.

It towers over the 15 hectares of vineyards that entirely belong to the company.

Cornarea is a family run business: the owner is Mrs Francesca Rapetti while her husband Piero Bovone and her son Gian Nicola Bovone are the enologists. The elder son, Pierfranco Bovone, deals with public relations and sales.

The Cornarea wines are the result of a precise choice : that of reinforcing the historical relationship between local wines with their territory.

Cornarea was born in 1975, when 12 hectares of land were planted with Arneis grapes, the aim of which was saving and giving new life to this historical, autochthonous wine.

Cornarea, still now, follows the same philosophy and only makes wine with local grapes, Arneis and Nebbiolo.

These grapes are produced from the same vineyards and grown on the hill bearing the same name, which have, by now, reached their full growth.
